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
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Hear From Our Founders

We partnered with researchers from project aimed JPAL on а at evaluating the effectiveness of children as environmental changemakers within their families. Funded by the World Bank, the project was implemented in Patna and focuses on transforming school students in Grades 4 to 9 into "Green Warriors" or environmental champions. The initiative also measures their ability to share and influence environmental practices with friends and family members.

Facilitators, trained by VentureVillage, play a key role in guiding the students. The first round of training for 30 facilitators was conducted in December 2023, followed by a second round for 100 facilitators on January 2nd and 3rd, 2024. The training was led by Jacob Roshan, then Chief Program Officer at VentureVillage.

Green City Program Wrapped up in Global Public School



Project Ashakiran - A Solid Waste Management Initiative

Project Ashakiran, a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative launched bν Renault Nissan **Technology & Business Centre India** in August 2024, is addressing India's growing solid waste management crisis. With VentureVillage as the academic partner, this project targets the Singaperumal Koil Panchayat in Tamil Nadu as a pilot area, focusing on reducing plastic pollution and recycling promoting through education, community engagement, and awareness.

Central to this effort is VentureVillage's Green City course, which provides the foundation for waste management education schools. In September, we launched the program two schools government within the Singaperumal Koil Panchayat, engaging over 100 students across four classes.

These sessions. designed interactive, covered essential topics such as waste segregation, recycling, reducing plastic waste, and reusing materials. Activities included sorting dry and wet waste and learning about the environmental impact of plastic. This initiative is ongoing, with more sessions planned for the future.

Education For Ecological Transformation - Research Project

The Education for Ecological Transformation is a research program funded by the Max Planck Society. Munich and the **University of** Innsbruck, Austria. The program is led by two researchers based in Prof. Esther Europe: Blanco, Professor of Economics in the Department of Public Finance at the University of Innsbruck, Austria, and Sherif. a behavioural Raisa economist at the Max Planck Society in Munich. Currently, the program is being implemented in schools across Spain and Austria. Venture Village leads the implementation of the program in India.

The program analyzes the impact of raising climate change awareness among students and examines how it affects their attitudes toward the environment. The primary goal is to foster a deeper understanding among students of how their influence collective behaviours environmental outcomes.

Through interactive sessions and games, students are encouraged to reflect on their roles in climate change and to ask, "What can we do about it?" This approach is designed to inspire active learning about behaviour changes that can reduce ecological footprints.



Education For Ecological Transformation - Research Project

The program equips students with the knowledge and practical skills needed to actively participate in mitigating climate change, fostering a sense of responsibility and empowering them to believe in their ability to make a difference

The first pilot of the program took place at St. Peter's School, that saw participation from 188 students. The second pilot was held at Rajagiri Public School in Kochi, where the program was implemented across five sections of the 9th grade. A total of 177 students participated, with eight facilitators leading the sessions over two days, on the 8th and 9th of August.

The next phase of the program took place at Alif Global School and MES Kaithapoyil. At Alif Global School, students from grades 7, 8, and 9 participated, with 50 students in total. Three facilitators led the interactive sessions, held on the 11th and 25th of October. Meanwhile. at **MES** Kaithapovil, approximately 100 students from grades 7, 8, and 9 participated in sessions on the 18th and 25th of October, with eight facilitators leading the activities.

Subsequently, the program was held at MES Thalassery on the 11th and 12th of November, where 58 students from grades 6, 8, and 9 took part in sessions led by five facilitators.

The next phase of the program is set to involve 90 classrooms and will span the academic year 2025-26.

Green City Course at ECI Stanley Tam Matriculation High School

As part of the second phase of Project Ashakiran, the Green City Course is being offered to **ECI School**, educational institution private located Koil Singaperumal Panchayat. The sessions. which began on November 4th, aim to raise awareness about waste foster and management environmental responsibility among students. Around 60 students from grades 7, 8, and 9 are participating in this initiative.

The sessions are structured to achieve several key objectives. First, they seek to raise awareness about the importance of proper waste management, with particular emphasis on waste segregation. Students are educated on the global challenges associated with waste management and the far-reaching impacts of waste on ecosystems and human health. In addition, the sessions aim to instill a sense of environmental responsibility among the students, encouraging them to adopt eco-friendly habits in their daily lives. The course also seeks to

engage the students in activities that enhance their critical thinking skills and empower them to take personal action toward a cleaner, greener environment.

This ongoing initiative, led by Subject Expert Reshma Chandran, will span six weeks, with the program slated to conclude by the end of January 2025. This extended duration ensures that the students have ample opportunity to deepen their understanding of waste management and its global implications, while also encouraging them to actively contribute to environmental conservation.
